I am your friendly WTA rep for the NY State Retirement System. I just attended the yearly NYSTRS meeting representing our union and have some useful information to share. Most of this will interest those who are nearing retirement but there is also material that everyone might find useful.



#### **Home Covid Test Kits**

If you have health insurance through the district, you can sign up for the App below to get free COVID tests sent to your home. It is easy to do and they say delivered in 1-2 days. I was told that with increased demand that may end up being 3-5 days. It took me about 10 minutes to confirm my information, sign up for the app and order tests for my whole family.

If you need to be tested, use your smartphone camera to scan this QR code and order your at-home test kit.



You can also order a test kit by downloading and logging in to the Sydney<sup>SM</sup> Health mobile app and going to the COVID-19 Resources page. Find Sydney Health on the App Store<sup>®</sup> or Google Play<sup>™</sup>. If you don't want to wait for a kit to come in the mail, check your local pharmacy for over-the-counter COVID-19 tests. These tests are available at your expense.
